To grasp the enormity of these words Angela Merici would challenge us today, to look back over the 60 years to when this College first began in 1959....

The very foundations of this College have been built on



It happened like this....

The city of Canberra was built to be the capital of Australia representing all the States and Territories that make up Australia. When the first Catholic High School was to be built in Canberra, Archbishop Eris O'Brien wanted it to be

- inclusive on all levels,
- a place welcoming ALL,
- embracing not just one group of teaching Sisters but many, thus
- reflecting the diversity and uniqueness of our Australian Community.

Looking back it is clear that, the then Braddon Catholic Girls High School (now Merici College) was founded on the

MODEL of COLLABORATIVE WOMENS' LEADERSHIP (an Angela model).

Such a venture was ahead of its time, probably the first of its kind, calling forth the "pooling" of the charisms, gifts and talents of the six Founding Religious Congregations (including the Ursulines) for the purpose of the education of young women.



It was in 1959, the leaders of SIX Religious Congregations, as represented by these SIX house banners (designed in later years)...

- The Good Samaritans,
- The Brigidines,
- The Sisters of Mercy,
- The Josephites,
- Presentation Sisters and
- The Ursulines.

Over recent years Merici College Community has embraced, <u>once more</u>, the charism of the six founding Congregations. This was done by inviting any Sisters from these Congregations, who may still be living in Canberra, to come and be <u>once more</u> "a strong presence" through participating, whenever possible, in the daily life of the College Community.

This "strong presence" is visibly expressed by each Religious Congregation, as they whole-heartedly support the staff and students in

- understanding the Charism of each Foundress,
- Reflecting, discussing and sharing of ways Merici College Community can embrace these Charisms, and
- celebrating "the variety of gifts" through participating in College Liturgies, House activities and Special Day celebrations.



Last year, as part of its preparation for this 60th Year Celebration, the Merici College Community welcomed the planting of the Angela Merici Rose in the College garden.

Even today, the Angela story and the

Merici College story continue to be entwined around this little rose.

A few weeks ago at a Merici College Eucharistic Celebration of the Feast of St Angela, NEW House banners were unfolded. The designs are a modern interpretation of the Charism of the six founding Religious Groups.



Amazingly, these newly designed banners were "secretly" created by the College Community WITHOUT any input from the Religious Groups. As each banner was revealed and its symbolism explained it was a moment of GREAT JOY. Obviously, this College Community not only understands, but has continued to embrace the charism of the six Founding Religious Groups.

The Brescia Banner (Ursuline) depicts:

The open book of life-long learning.

Out of this foundation grows the <u>Vine</u>, "Cultivate the vine entrusted to you." (Angela)

The <u>Angela Rose</u> blooms at the top of the Vine in the shape of a UNIVERSAL HEART reflecting the Charism of the Ursulines...
